Guides are placed in high schools, where they develop and execute strategies to build a culture promoting postsecondary access, participation and success. They work collaboratively with counselors, teachers, and the community to provide direct student advising while being a positive cultural catalyst. They advise and assist high school students with college and career exploration, curricular choices, and the full spectrum of enrollment, admission and financial aid processes for education after high school. A successful Guide is self-directed, strategic, professional yet accessible, able to work with multiple stakeholders, and knowledgeable of higher education and the challenges facing underserved youth. This guide will work with students at Kodiak High School and the associated village schools in the KIBSD.
