Student Personal

Student is determined to be either dependent or independent for financial aid purposes

FAFSA PROCESS QUICK GUIDE

FAFSA-Free Application for Federal Student

FAFSA is a one-stop application to gain access to federal, state, institutional, and other funding for education and career training expenses.

Aid

Dependency Status

Identifies if a Student needs a Contributor to submit information on their FAFSA. Dependent Students require Parent Contributor(s). Independent Students require a Spouse Contributor only if married.

FINANCIAL AID TERMS;

Contributor

Anyone required to provide information, consent and approval, and a signature on the FAFSA form.

StudentAid.gov Account (FSA ID)

Each Student and Contributor must have a separate StudentAid.gov Account (FSA ID) with the Federal Student Aid (FSA) to access, sign, and submit the FAFSA.

Student Aid Index (SAI)

Eligibility index number used by Financial Aid Offices to determine how much aid a Student would receive if they attended a school. The SAI is not a dollar amount and can be negative, which reflects a higher financial need.

Prior-Prior Year (PPY)

Tax information from two years prior to the academic year a Student plans to attend college or career training school.

FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS)

Report that includes the information reported on the 2026-27 FAFSA. FSS includes Student Aid Index (SAI) and estimates for a Pell Grant and federal loans, and if a Student has been selected for verification.

FAFSA DOCUMENTS

Completing the FAFSA has never been easier! Most of the required tax information for Students and Contributors is imported automatically into the FAFSA from the IRS through the Direct Data Exchange (DDX). This process happens behind the scenes. However, there may be a time when individuals need to manually input financial information. If so, here are documents and information to have readily available:

- Social Security Number (SSN)
- Alien Registration Number (if any)
- Statements for checking and savings accounts, cash, investments, etc.
- Prior-Prior Year's Tax Information:
 - IRS 1040's plus all the Schedules; W-2's
 - Federal Benefits Received, such as Medicaid, Federal Housing Assistance, SNAP, TANF, WIC, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Free or Reduced Price School Lunch, etc.
