




FAQs Continuing Eligibility Course Requirement

I was unable to complete one or more of my classes during the spring term as a result of the COVID-19 disaster. How will this affect my continuing eligibility for APS?

The State of Alaska is waiving the credit hour requirements for APS continuing eligibility for attendance from March 11, 2020 through July 16, 2020. You still need to meet the GPA requirement for continuing eligibility.

I was unable to complete one or more of my classes in the spring due to the COVID-19 disaster. Will I have to return any of the funds?

No.

Do I need to document the reason I did not complete the courses to meet APS continuing eligibility requirements?

No documentation is required to qualify for this waiver.

As a student, what do I need to do to have the APS continuing eligibility requirement waived?

No action is required on your part. ACPE is working with your school to address this.

Will I need to catch up on any credit hour deficiencies next year to meet future APS continuing eligibility requirements?

No, any credit hour deficiencies waived for attendance from March 11, 2020 through July 16, 2020, are not required to be made up for continued eligibility going forward.

How long will this requirement be waived?

The continuing eligibility related to credit hour completion is waived for attendance March 11, 2020 through July 16, 2020.
