

## **APS Delivers: 2011-2018**

The Alaska legislature enacted the Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS) in 2011 to inspire our state's high school students to prepare for success in college and career training. Since inception, 19,492 Alaska high school graduates completed the rigorous requirements and have become eligible for scholarships to pursue postsecondary education in Alaska.

### Goal #2 Alaska Students Excel in High School

- 77% Achieve better grades
- 72% Take placement exams
- 62% Seek out college/academic advising
- 64% Take challenging courses

Did you know?

APS can be used for university studies as well as career or technical training.

High school students start working to qualify as early as freshman year, knowing that if they do their part, the award will be there for them.

APS recipients must meet further requirements in college/training to continue to receive the APS.

The APS is funded through earnings of the Alaska Higher Education Investment Fund, created by the legislature to ensure long-term sustainable funding.
